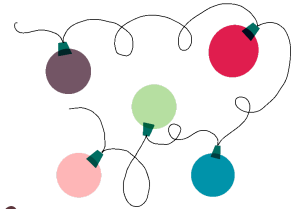

Bible Lesson



MOSES AND THE BURNING BUSH EXODUS 2:24

Moses had grown up in Pharaoh's palace, but he knew that he was a Hebrew, just like the Israelite slaves. He went out to see the Hebrew people at work and noticed that a slave was badly mistreated by an Egyptian. Moses became angry and killed the Egyptian in a rage. He knew that word would soon get back to Pharaoh and he was afraid for his life! Moses decided to run away to the land of Midian where he lived as a shepherd for many years.

As Moses was out with his flock of sheep he saw a strange sight. There was a bush on fire! Things got even weirder. Moses heard God speaking to him through the flames! God told Moses that he was standing on holy ground so he must remove his shoes.

Read Exodus 3:9: "The cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. So now, go, I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt."

God had a big job for Moses! Moses was afraid that the Israelites wouldn't listen to him. He was also afraid because he wasn't a very good speaker.

Moses made all sorts of excuses to God, but God promises to be with those whom He calls! Moses didn't need to be afraid because God would be with him no matter what. In fact, God would work through Moses to rescue the Israelites. Moses worried that he wouldn't know what to say when the Israelites asked who sent him to rescue them.

Read Exodus 3:14: "God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'"

God is so big and so powerful that He can't have an ordinary name. When God says that His name is I AM He is saying that He has no beginning or end. He is telling us that He is the one true God, and we can trust Him! It was hard for Moses at first, but he finally obeyed God's call to return to Egypt to rescue the Israelites from slavery.

Sometimes God asks us to do things that might be hard, but in the end they bring Him the most glory. It might be something like being kind to your brother or sister. Sometimes it's hard to obey God, but He always gives us the strength to do what He's asked us to do.
